id in 2020, GGC's work pertaining to NHA 5 and 6 buildings is coming to a close. This project was ran by Superintendent Brett Blanton and a very large support crew. NHA 5 and 6 scope included: 50,114 SF of concrete poured from the original bid throughout building 5, building 6, and the admin building. The work included concrete paving, concrete walls, curb, heavy duty paving, housekeeping pads, MEP pads, slab on grade, depressed slabs, slab on metal deck, topping slabs, and stem walls. NHA 5 and 6 are part of a large campus in Huntsville, AL that GGC has continued to work on for Holder Construction, moving on to the next phase project MCA. In the past few years GGC has had the pleasure of bidding and completing data center work for Holder Construction in Huntsville and Charleston, South Carolina. The future looks bright in the data center realm of work and we hope to continue to bid and win these profitable data center jobs.

n the last six months GGC has been awarded (3) linear accelerator (LINAC) projects with Turner Construction and - Haskell. The Turner projects are in-town spearheaded by Superintendent Doug Sutton (Braselton, GA and Roswell, GA). The Haskell Linac project is just outside of Jacksonville, Florida with Roger Black running point. If you're wondering what a linear accelerator vault is, here's a quick rundown: A medical linear accelerator (LINAC) is the device most commonly used for external beam radiation treatments for patients with cancer. It delivers high -energy x-rays or electrons to the region of the patient's tumor. These treatments can be designed in such a way that they destroy the cancer cells while sparing the surrounding normal tissue. Some interesting structural facts about GGC's scope: Wall thickness ranges from 3ft –6ft wide at a wall height between 14ft-24 ft tall. Each LINAC has between 40-80 tons of rebar within the walls and lid that cover a room no bigger than 250 square feet.



Pictured left is the completed interior of a linear accelerator vault. The cost of the

machine alone ranges from 2.4 Million—2.8 Million dollars. All of GGC's LINAC projects will wrap up by October of 2022.

Hardscape Spotlight

King Memorial



Shown above is the **King Memorial** project. With a contract amount of \$926,000, GGC's hardscape scope on the project included: fireplace installation, trellis construction, pedestal pavers, steel planters, cast-in-place stairs and sidewalks. This project is GGC's second project with **Fortune Johnson** and is located near Oakland Cemetery. The project is unique in location and access to the courtyards was challenging. GGC is hoping that this project opens the door to much more work with Fortune Johnson.

Lane Park





Pictured is the Lane Park project awarded to GGC by HOAR Construction. With a contract amount of \$930,000 the scope included: Integral color sidewalks, brick pavers, and miscellaneous site furnishings. This open-aired retail project in Mountain Brook, Alabama has some of GGC's finest hardscape work in place.

Along with Paul we added Derreck Bartlett as a full-time driver to help support GGC's needs in this logistical area of the Company. In addition, Jonathan Browning has transitioned to a Preconstruction role as a Senior Project Estimator currently supporting both the Commercial and Industrial Business Units.
